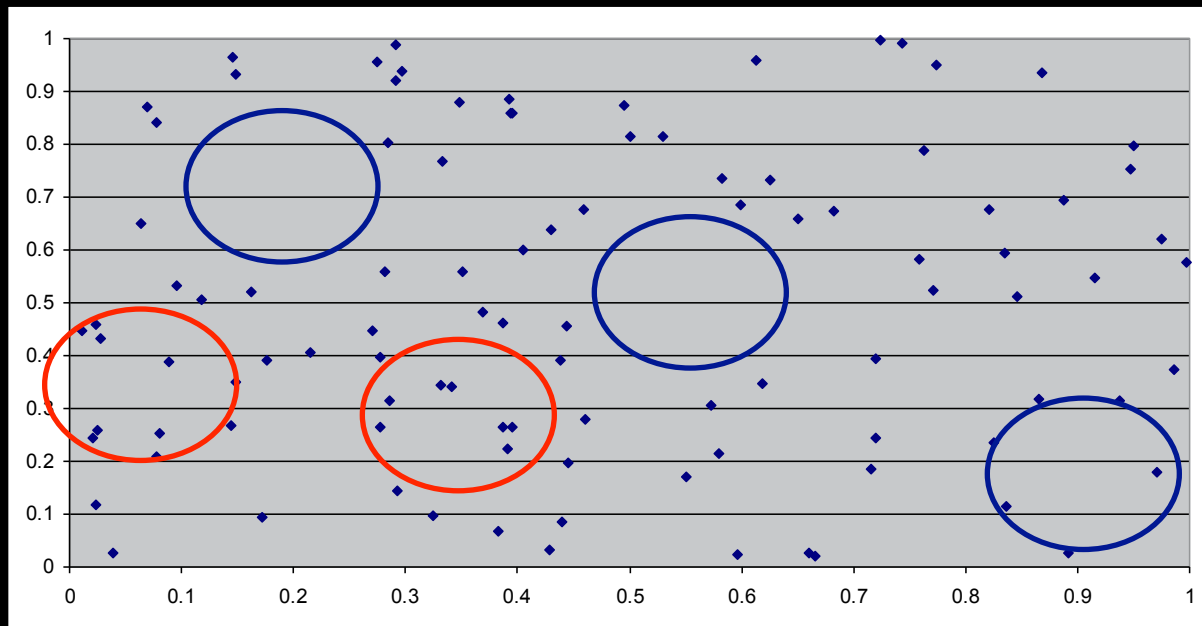

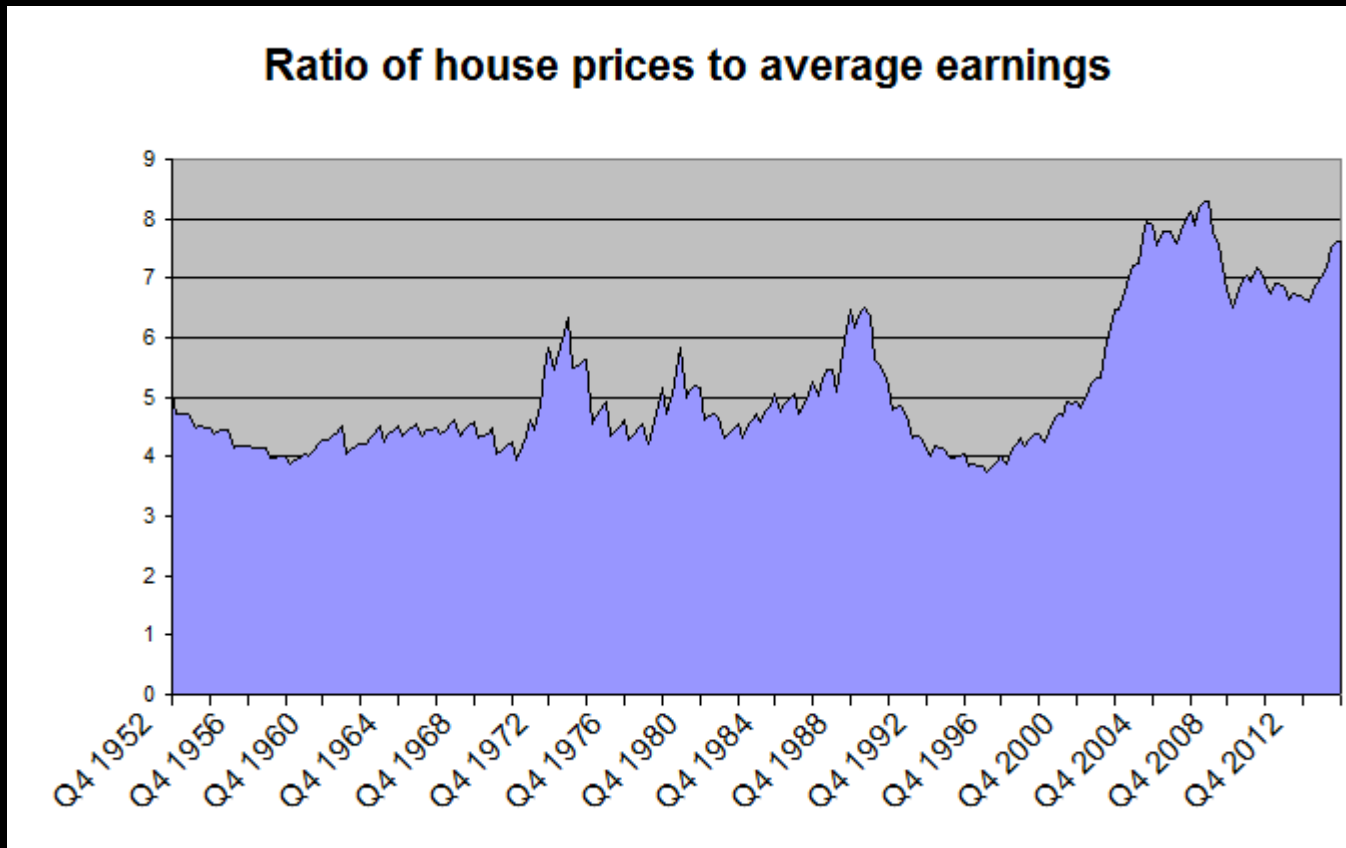

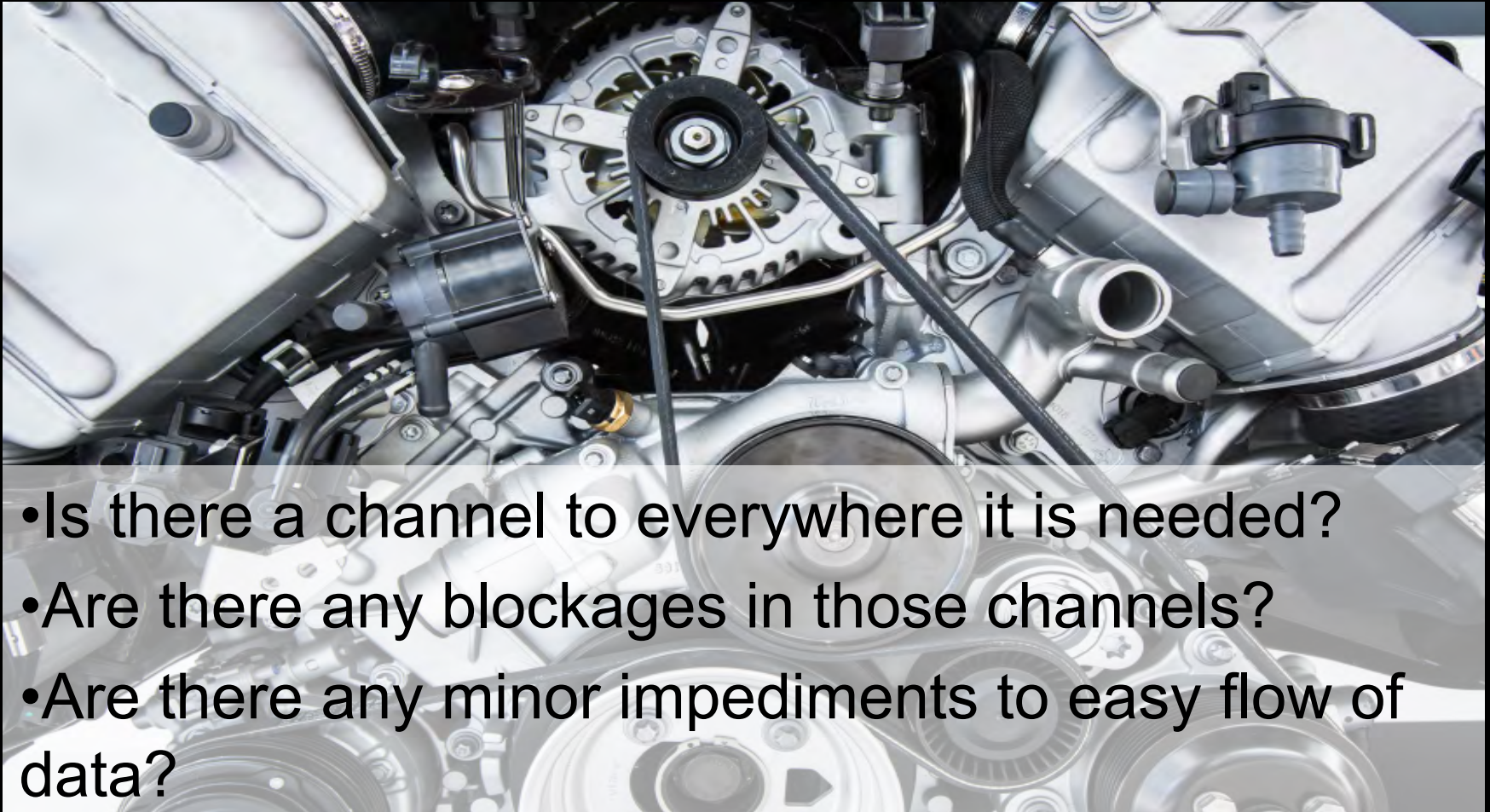
- Challenge received wisdom

# Prerequisites of a data-driven organisation

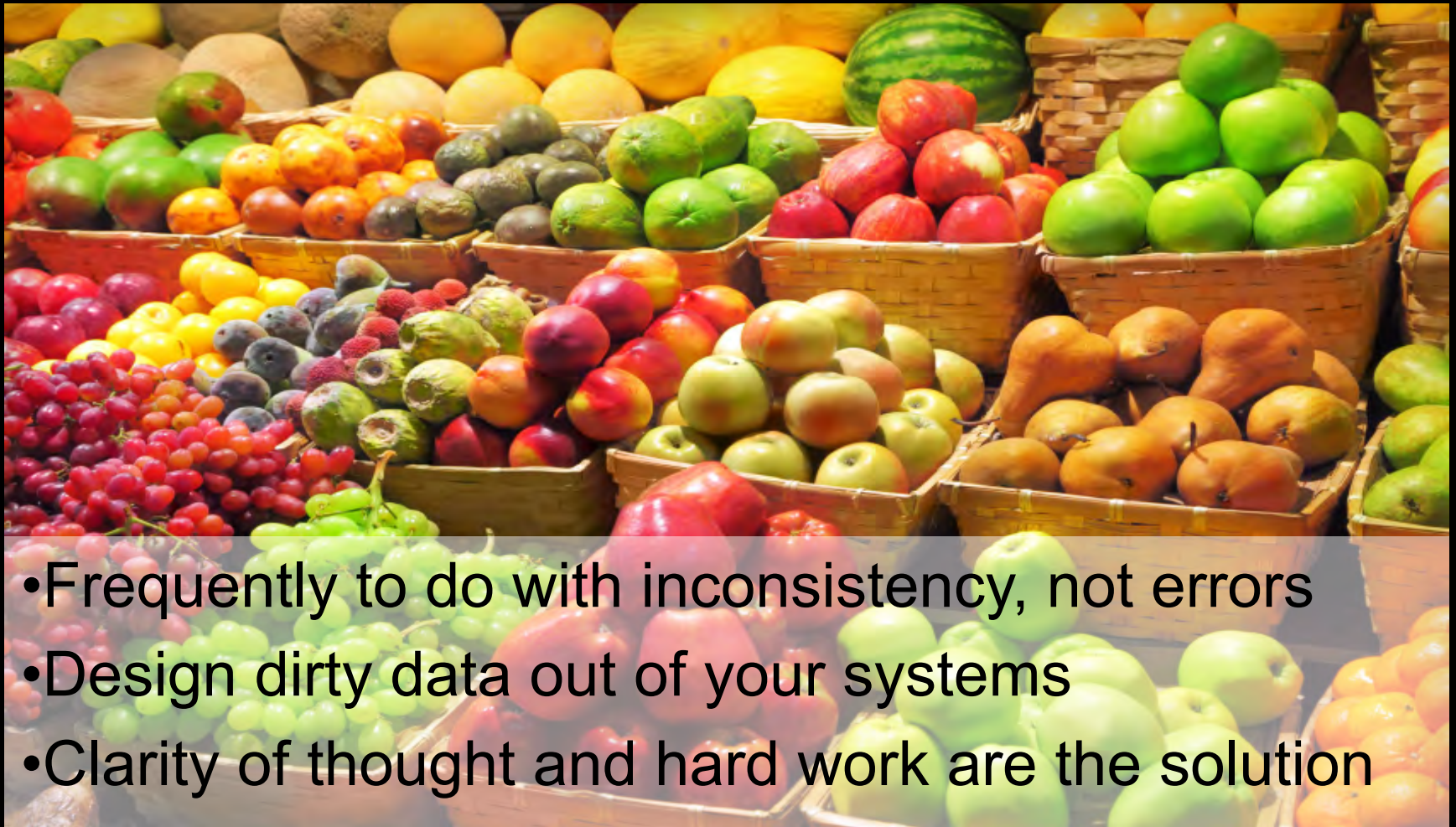
- Data availability

# Issue #1: Data availability



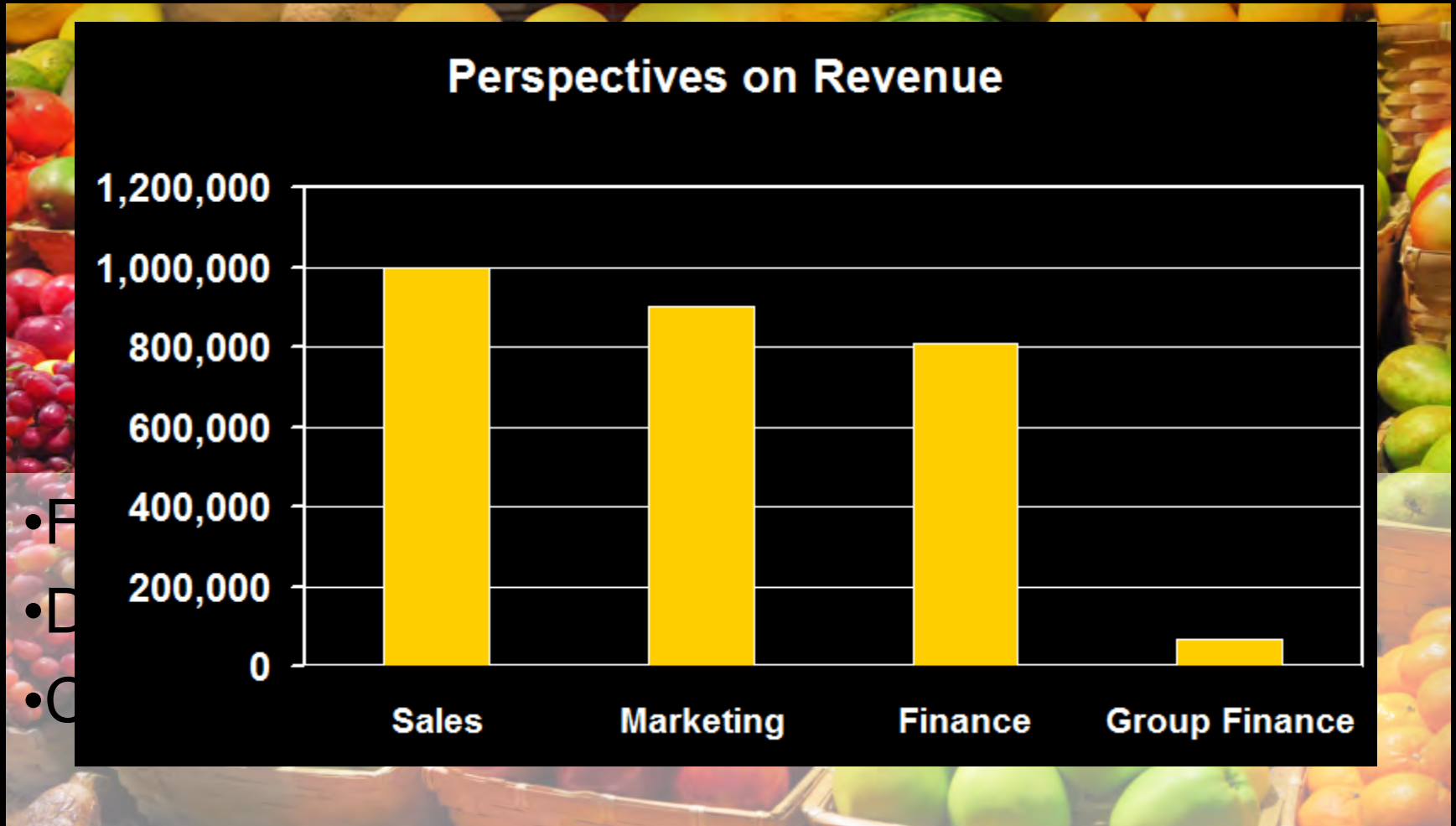
- Is there a channel to everywhere it is needed?

## Issue #2: Data quality

- Design dirty data out of your systems
- Clarity of thought and hard work are the solution
